1. Welcome

G Callander welcomed all attendees and acknowledged the Traditional Owners of the land on which we are gathered and paid respects to their elders both past and present. It was noted that the agenda format for this meeting has been altered as the AEDC presentation has been open to stakeholders across the municipality. The formalities of the meeting will follow the AEDC Presentation.

2. AEDC Presentation

Cathie Nolan, AEDC Project Director, DET

The Australian Early Development Census (AEDC) is a survey of children in their first year of primary school completed every three years by teachers across Australia. Five domains are measured through AEDC; physical health and well-being, emotional maturity, social competence, language and cognitive skills, communication and general knowledge. There has been four sets of data with the most recently released being the 2018 data, this has allowed tracking of populations over time.

Data can be accessed from the AEDC data explorer website including a Community Profile and Community Summary for each local government area, demographic and survey data

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can be broken down into individual suburbs. Examples of survey questions were shared, as was data from the City of Melton. Two case studies were shared identifying how AEDC data has been used in planning and program delivery.

When using the data it is important recognise that there are many variables that impact, look at the context and consider the whole community as well as any complementary data we might have. Discussion was held about the importance of interpreting the AEDC data together with local knowledge that we have about the Melton communities.

The Comprehensive Monitoring Project was introduced to the Committee, this is a project is reconceptualising Early Childhood Polices and Programs to strengthen lifelong health, looking at the first 1000 days and moving to the first 10,000 days to include pregnancy, infancy, toddlerhood, preschool, middle childhood, adolescence, emerging adulthood, young adulthood and next generation and monitoring at these stages to frame policies and programs.

C Owens questioned access to Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander Children data, C Nolan explained that permission needs to be provided by specific communities, information is currently provided to local Aboriginal controlled organisations and they decide how their information is shared.

7. General Business

7.1 Best Start update

Best Start continues to work on increasing attendance of children in MCH, Supported Playgroups, Early Start Kinder and 4 year old kindergarten. Part of this work has included being involved in the evaluation group for the Koolin Balit project, which has recently been completed. Discussion was held around the success of the program within the municipality and the group acknowledged the work of C Owens and the Pathways Workers in the success of this project

7.2 DET update

Fiona Norman, Early Childhood Performance and Planning Advisor (ECPAPA), DET

F Norman circulated a DET fact sheet regarding the roll out of 3 year old Kindergarten to support communicating information to stakeholders and the community. Further information will be provided as part of the Government's communication strategy.

School readiness funding has been well utilised by Kindergartens who are currently completing their mid-year review surveys and will soon be identifying needs for 2020 school readiness plans.

The 2019-20 Children's Facilities Capital Program has been launched, in addition to the new Inclusive Kindergartens grants round. Applications for the Inclusive Kindergartens program grants close at midnight on Friday 12 July for equipment grants, and midnight on Friday 9 August for buildings and playground projects. The Victorian School Building Authority team are available to assist with the process and to answer any questions from prospective applicants.

Discussion was held around the available grants. B Ball stated that Council is looking into current needs and that there are plans to apply for grants through the grants program once the needs are clarified.

Awaiting further update as to the Machinery of Government changes which will involve Maternal and Child Health and Supported Playgroups moving from DET to DHHS.

7.3 DHHS update

Jarney Newey, Deputy Area Operations Manager - Case Management, DHHS

DHHS Child Protection staff met with four Melton MCH nurses. 10 staff in total attended. Both agencies got value from the session and were able to learn more about service delivery complexities from each other.

Child Protection has begun a partnership with the Royal Children's Hospital. This partnership provides regular secondary consults for children known to Child Protection, to assist with identifying health, wellbeing and developmental needs.

Salvation Army are no longer providing Out of Home Care effective 1 June 2019, foster care will now be provided through Oz Child. Oz Child is to be located around Sunshine, the location has not yet been confirmed.

DHHS is undertaking an audit of Out of Home Care children currently attending Early Start Kindergarten, 4 year old kindergarten, Childcare and the level of attendance at School. This will look at specifically at eligibility and whether children are enrolled in appropriate services. The purpose is to build the capacity of the workforce to understand what supports and services are available for caregivers and ensuring children are placed in the right services to meet their needs.

8. Other Business

L Carli provided information about a booklet produced by the organization Amaze available to support families of children with Autism. A number of attendees were aware of this booklet.

- J. Macfarlane questioned the wording in the DET promotional video around Early Start Kindergarten (ESK). Specifically the wording of 'other family services' in regards to refugee and asylum seekers accessing ESK. It was confirmed the video was referring to Integrated Family Services. F. Norman acknowledged that there are discussions occurring at DET in regards to extending the eligibility, however no change as yet.
