Item 8.1 Parliamentarian and Departmental Letters received by the Mayor Appendix 1 Letter from Luke Cornelius - Assistant Commissioner for the North West Metropolitan Region - dated 6 August 2020



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While I note Council is of the view that establishing a policing hub may support our ability to improve community safety, policing is most effective when policing resources are supported by a service delivery model which allows us to be as agile and as adaptive as those who act to defeat community safety. One of the unintended consequences of a "bricks and mortar" approach to policing is that it nails at least 24 pairs of boots to that site, simply to keep the new "shop" open and so seriously limits our ability to deploy our people to where the community most needs us; in their streets, in their homes and where our community goes to work, school shop, or enjoy themselves.

We therefore prefer an approach where we are seeking to upgrade and modernise existing plant and equipment so our people are better supported to prevent, deter, detect, investigate and arrest those who would do our community harm, not in police stations, but where that harm is occurring.

Victoria Police has therefore developed a staffing allocation model, based on demand growth factors (which include projected population growth, crime rates and calls for service), which we use to inform government decisions about where additional police should be deployed to service future growth, rather than only building additional sites which would tie our people to a fixed point service delivery model.

I also advise that Victoria Police will be reviewing our service delivery model over the next couple of years to ensure our "footprint", our staffing levels and the way we task our people better supports a safer community because police are where the community most needs us. As we develop the service delivery model, your local police, through Superintendent Jones and Inspector Dunstan will take the opportunity to engage with the communities we serve to ensure we understand community needs and challenges and ensure these are considered as we improve our service delivery.

We therefore look forward to continuing our work towards a safer community with the City of Melton.
