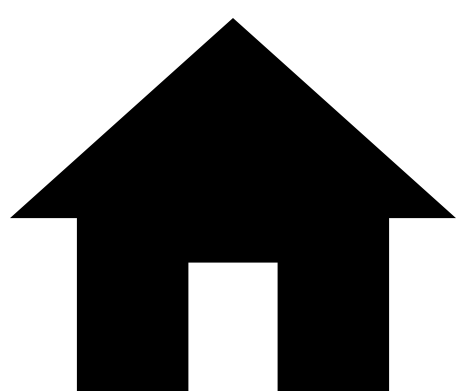

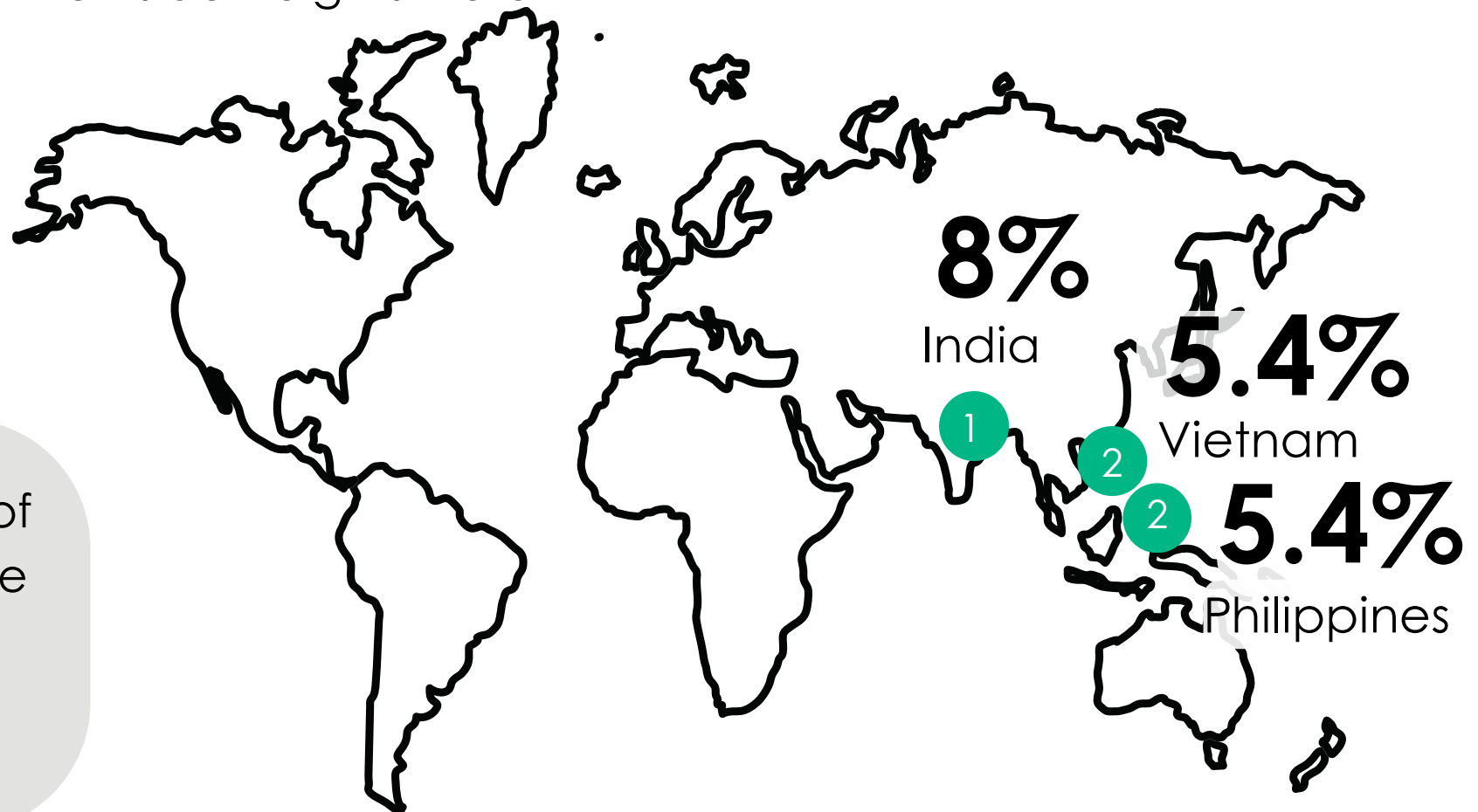


Place of birth

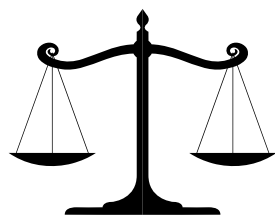

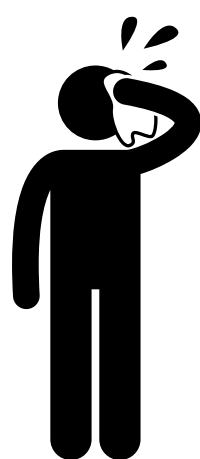
