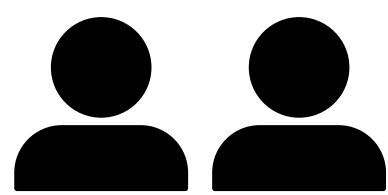

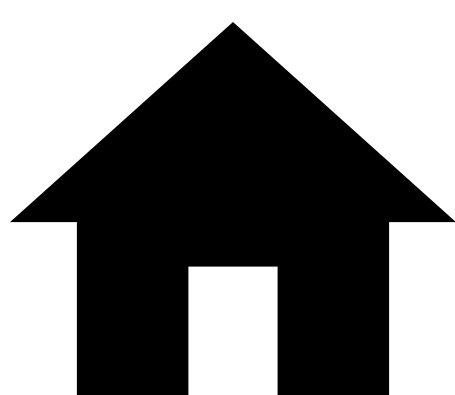

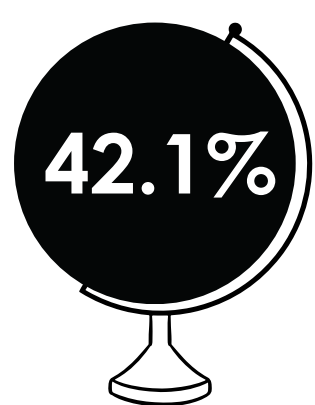

Place of birth

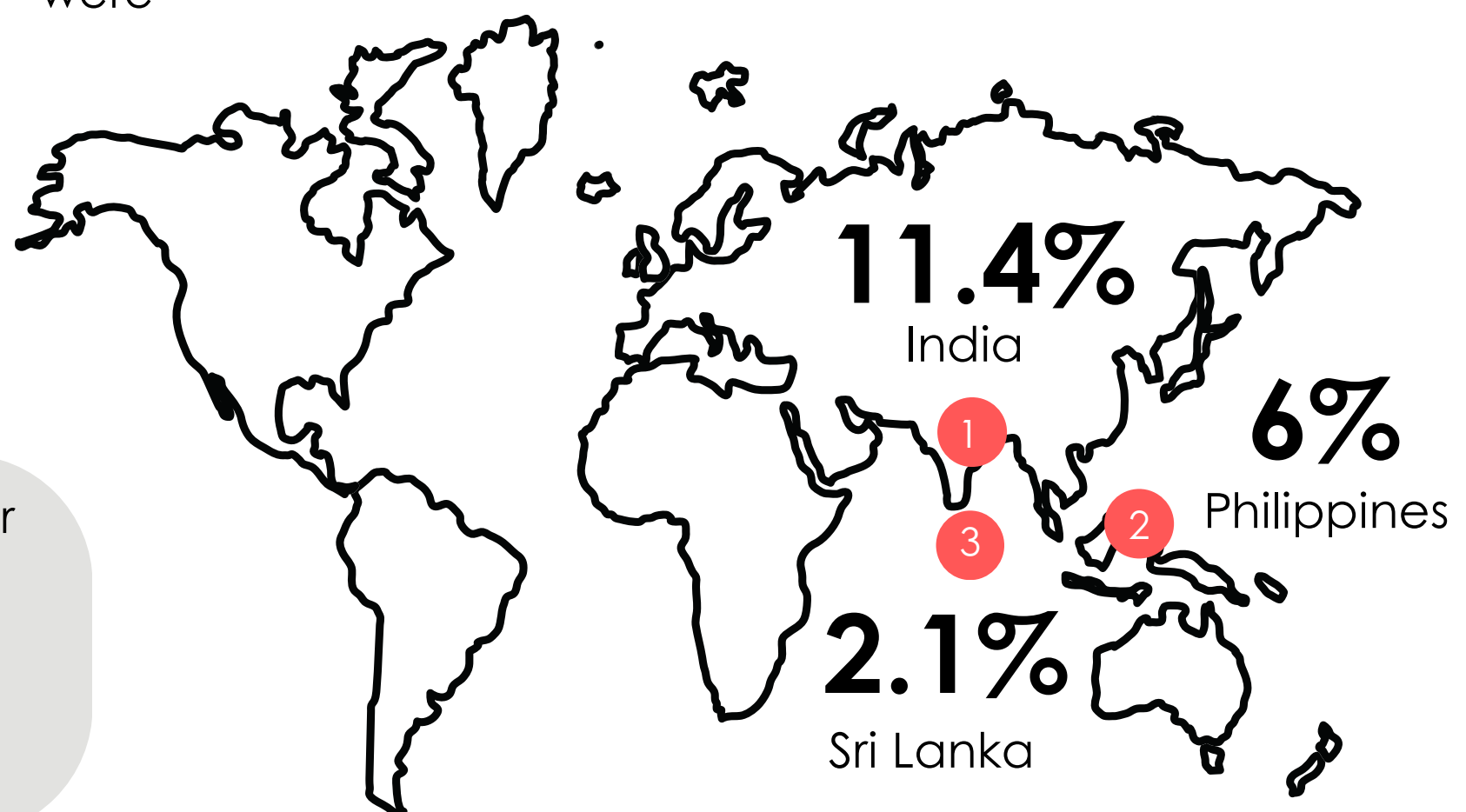
The top three countries of birth outside of Australia for Fraser Rise were

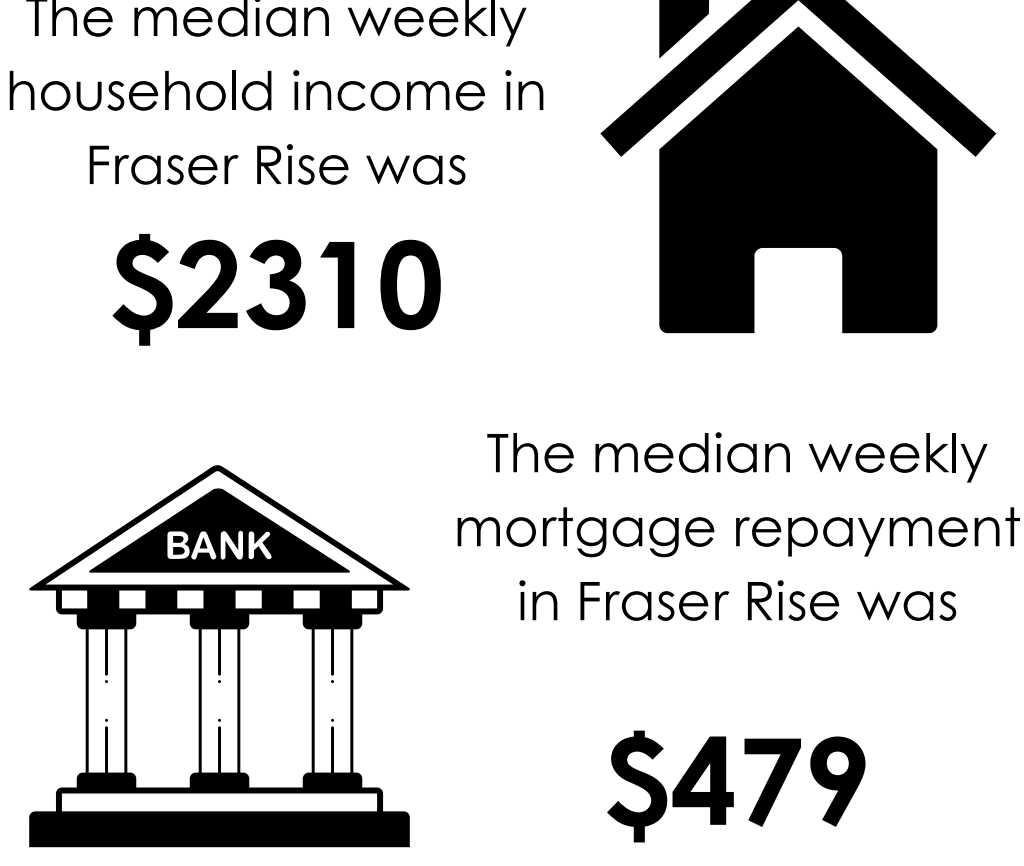
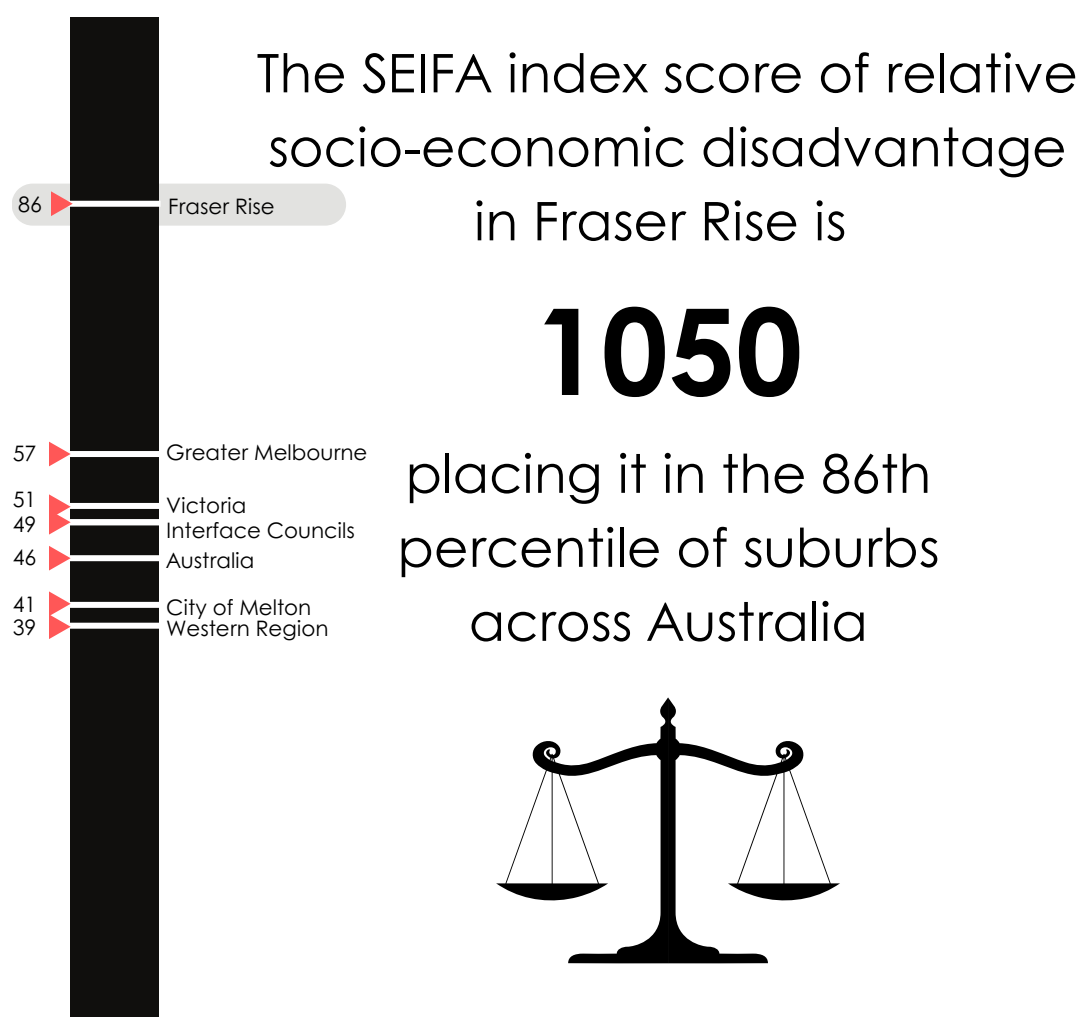
of people in Fraser Rise over 15 provided unpaid care to children - this equates to 2,517 people. Of these, 296 were caring for children other than their own.

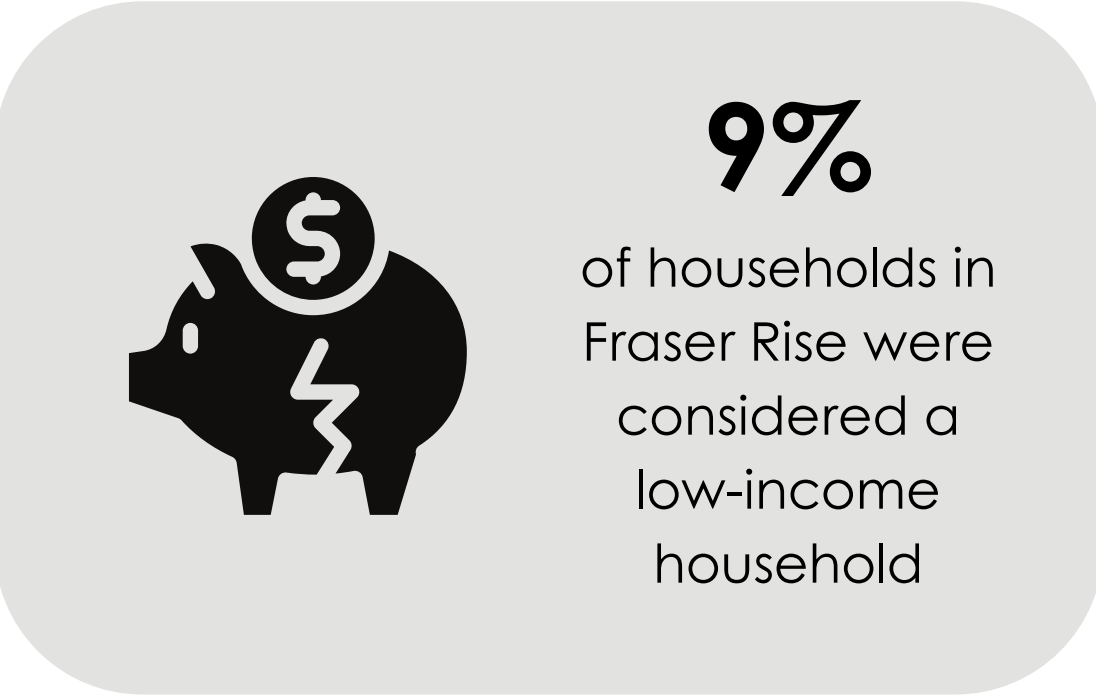
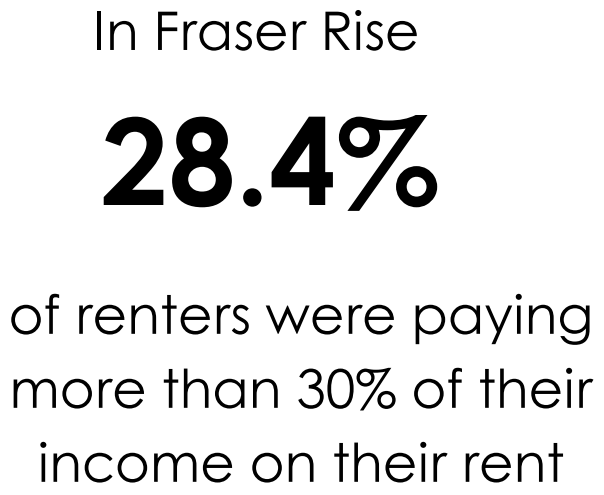
