Road projects update

A series of road works that will make our roads safer and better suited to our growing community, are underway.

Signalised Intersection in Caroline Springs

To ease traffic congestion and improve safety, the roundabout on the corner of Caroline Springs Boulevard and Rockbank Middle Road is being upgraded.

The works will expand and realign the road, and will include new traffic lights, landscaping and public lighting.

CONSTRUCTION DATES:

November 2023 to early 2025

PROJECT VALUE: \$10 million

Hume Drive Duplication, Taylors Hill

In good news for Taylors Hill residents, we are duplicating Hume Drive between Gourlav Road and Calder Park Drive from two to four lanes and adding a new road

The current single lane road is very congested at peak times and this road duplication will improve the flow of traffic along Hume Drive making it safer for all road users.

December 2023 to early 2025

Capital Projects update

Diggers Rest Recreation Reserve



Local cricket and footy comps are enjoying a new era at Diggers Rest Recreation Reserve thanks to a series of major upgrades - the latest step in a major project that is transforming the reserve for residents and sporting clubs.

The redevelopment of Oval 2 included the installation of new irrigation and LED lighting and realigning the oval to allow more teams to train in a safer environment. The cricket nets now have four lanes and can be used all year.

The upgrades are part of a partnership between Melton City Council and the Victorian Government. Council invested \$155,000 in the nets, and \$750,000 in the redevelopment of the oval.

The State Government invested \$100.000 on the nets and \$1.5 million towards the oval.

Changing places Facility opened in Caroline Springs



A new Changing Place facility at Caroline Springs Leisure Centre has boosted access to sport and recreation facilities for people with high support needs.

Changing Places ensure everyone can access bathroom and toilet facilities with dignity and support.

This \$280,000 upgrade provides a welcoming and inclusive place that features a height adjustable, adult-sized changing bench, a tracking hoist system and space for two people either side of the toilet.

This is the fourth Changing Places facility in the City of Melton, with others located at Melton Waves, Cobblebank Stadium and the Melton Library and Learning Hub.

This project was supported by a \$110,000 grant from the Victorian Government.



Pets



Have you added any furry friends to your family in recent months?

Pets are an important part of the family and bring enormous benefits. They also come with responsibilities, including the requirement to register your dog and cat with Council.

Registration means Council has an up-to-date record of your pet's name and your contact details so we can quickly return lost pets to their owners. It also helps keep the community safe.

All dogs and cats aged over three months must be microchipped and registered with Council.

Kids Zone opened in Melton Town Centre



A Kids Zone play space has been installed near the amphitheatre in Melton Town Centre as part of a broader revitalisation plan.

The play space is in the centre of our key community and business precincts, increasing the time visitors spend in the area and boosting community connections. Based around a multi-level Tree House, the structure has play areas and climbing elements.

The State Government contributed \$450,000 toward the project with Council contributing \$150,000 as part of the Melton Revitalisation program. The program aims to support local traders and boost visitors to the town centre.

Tribute to unmarked graves at Melton Cemetary



A reflective space to acknowledge a series of unmarked graves, including those of Aboriginal Ancestors and early European settlers, has been unveiled at Melton Cemetery.

The new space pays tribute to more than 100 people buried there and acknowledges the area as a place of rest for Aboriginal ancestors and early European Settlers. The section is in the oldest operating part of the cemetery. People were interred there from the 1860s to around 1896.

This design of the reflective space is centred around a Hearth – a central point around which we can gather and unites us all – and formally acknowledges all the history of this section this as a place of rest.

Council worked in partnership with the Wurundjeri Woi-wurrung Cultural Heritage Aboriginal Corporation and the Melton Historical Society to co-design this space.

Registrations for three- and fouryear-old funded kindergarten in 2025 are open on 20 March. If your child is turning three or four by 30 April next year, they are eligible to attend kindergarten in 2025.

Make the most of your waste entitlements

Households receive the following entitlements each year:

Two At Home hard waste collections up to 3m³ from within your property boundary. Bookings essential. Visit melton.vic.gov.au/hardwaste OR

Two visits to the Melton Recycling Facility with a car or trailer up to 1m³.

OR

One visit to the Melton Recycling Facility and one At Home hard waste collection.

Options expire on 30 June 2024. Terms and conditions apply. Visit **melton.vic.gov.au/waste** for more information.

The good news is, either property owners or renters can take advantage of these annual waste entitlements. Renters will need to complete an online form and provide proof of residency.

Green bin
(food and garden organics)

Keep bags out of your green bin

Bags and caddy liners are not accepted in food and garden
organics bins in the City of Melton
- even if they are compostable.

Instead, you can line your kitchen caddy, or any container for collecting food scraps, with paper towel or newspaper and empty them into the green bin when full.

Using your green bin correctly means your food scraps and garden waste can be turned into compost.
