Join the campaign to end violence against women

Melton City Council will hold a range of events to help raise awareness and support the campaign for this year's 16 Days of Activism Against Gender Based Violence.

The international campaign aims to strengthen action to end violence against women and girls around the world.

More than 1 in 3 women have experienced men's violence. On average, a woman is killed by a man she knows every 10 days, and in 2024 that number is much higher.

The campaign begins on 25 November to coincide with International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women and ends on 10 December, which marks Human Rights Day.

Council encourages residents to participate in the various activities being held throughout the campaign and help drive support for the elimination of violence against women and children in our community.
