

A driver must not stop on a road between the centre of the road and another vehicle that is parked at the side of the road. This is known as 'double parking'.



A driver must not stop on a length of road or in an area to which a no stopping sign applies, even if you are only letting someone out of the car and regardless of whether you leave the engine running and stay in the car.

No stopping areas must be kept clear at all times. If times/ days are specified, restrictions are only applicable to the specified times.

# PARKING Road Rules

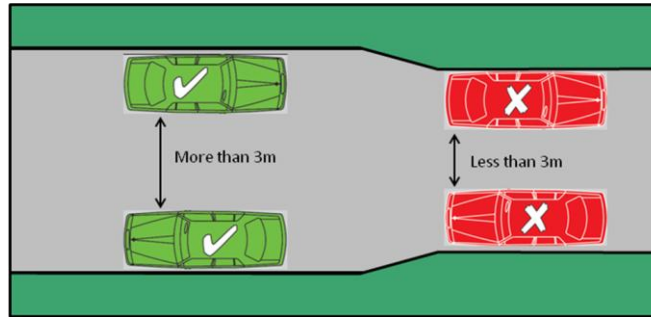
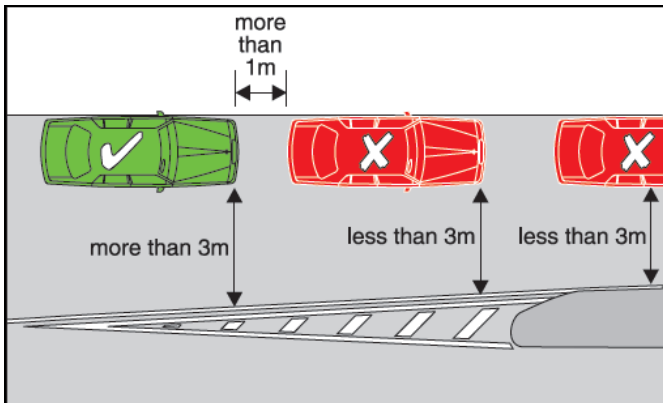

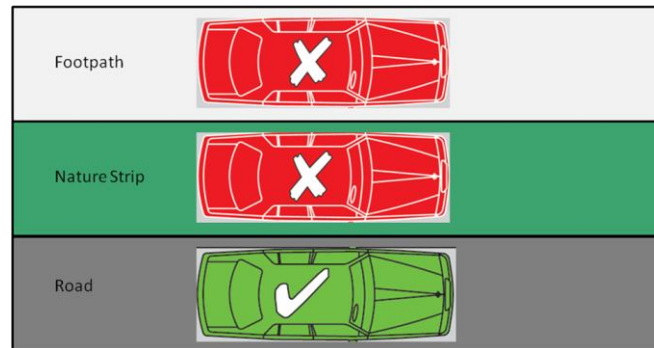
The driver must position the vehicle to face in the direction of travel.

If parking bays are not marked, the driver must:

- Position the vehicle parallel and as near as practicable to the far left side of the road.
- Position the vehicle at least 1 metre from the closest point of any vehicle in front of it and any vehicle behind it.
- Not unreasonably obstruct the path of other vehicles or pedestrian.
- If the road has a continuous dividing line or a dividing strip, the driver must position the vehicle at least 3 metres from the continuous dividing line or dividing strip



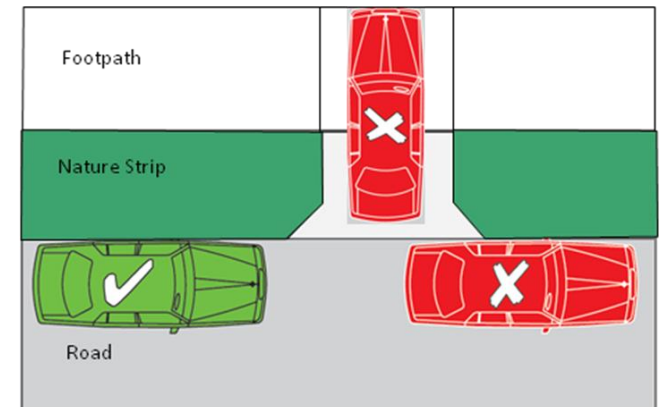
If the road does not have a continuous dividing line or a dividing strip, the driver must position the vehicle so there is at least 3 metres of the road alongside the vehicle that is clear for other vehicles to pass.



A driver must not stop on a footpath or on a nature strip adjacent to a length of road.

A driver must not stop on or across a driveway unless –

- is dropping off, or picking up, passengers; and
- does not leave the vehicle unattended; and
- completes the dropping off, or picking up, of the passengers, and drives on, as soon as possible and, in any case, within 2 minutes after stopping



A driver must not stop on a length of road or in an area to which a no parking sign applies, unless the driver is dropping off or picking up, passengers or goods. The driver cannot leave the vehicle unattended unless the driver is within three metres of the vehicle and must move on within two minutes after stopping.
