What is the name of the project? Developing a new community garden in Diggers Rest

What is the start date of the project? 17 June

What is the project? Upon approval of this grant request, we will be seeking Council approval to expand our impact on the Melton community by establishing a new community garden at the Diggers Rest Bowling Club. The Bowling Club have agreed for the group to utilise their land for this purpose. The Community Garden will be approximately 1000 square metres in size including 10 separate garden beds, 2 compost bins, one water tank and a storage shed. The garden beds will include a variety of fruits, vegetables and herbs and have irrigation systems to ensure the plants are well watered.

Why are you organising this project? We have had significant interest from the Diggers Rest community who are part of our group, to establish community garden that is closer to home and increase community access to fresh foods. Feedback from the Diggers Rest community has indicated that families do not have access to a large garden to grow their own foods. Our members from this area have also indicated that a community garden will help bring people together, make new friends and learn something new.
